

DOOR NETWORK PROJECT

Rising 7th and 8th Grade

Location: Atlanta, GA

Dates: Sunday, June 27 – Friday, July 2

Cost: \$275 includes transportation, food, lodging, materials for service experiences, and Fun Day admission fee for each participant. All participants to assist with the Missions Auction.

Ministry Partner: DOOR (*Developing Opportunities for Outreach and Reflection*) Network Project; www.doornetwork.org

Mission: "The DOOR Network exists to provide opportunities which help inform, educate, challenge, and motivate individuals to respond to the issues and concerns facing an increasingly urban world."

Possible Work Projects: For service assignments and meal preparation, our group will be divided into teams of 4-6 participants with at least one Westminster adult and a DOOR staff person. Work teams usually spend each day at a different service assignment. Opportunities to serve may include interacting with homeless people at shelters and soup kitchens, making and delivering meals for homebound AIDS and cancer patients, working at summer day camps for children in economically impoverished neighborhoods, sorting food and clothes at distribution centers, visiting with senior citizens and hearing the stories of the civil rights movement, or just walking through neighborhoods and becoming acquainted with people and places. DOOR helps groups see the face of God in the city. Through their time in the city, our youth will immerse themselves in urban life and serve in community-based ministries

Accommodations: Air mattresses at Central Presbyterian Church located in the heart of downtown Atlanta either attend a Braves baseball game or visit Stone Mountain. There is free time in the daily schedule for recreation activities (volleyball, soccer, basketball and Frisbee) at the church as well as exploring parts of the city as a group.

Transportation: We will pack the bus and vans at 8:30 a.m. on Sunday, June 27 and attend the 9:30 a.m. worship service at Friendly Avenue. We will depart for following worship and arrive in Atlanta following dinner around 6:30 p.m. We will primarily use public transportation (MARTA and public buses) while in Atlanta. We will return around 6 p.m. on Friday, July 2.

Team Size: 33 (includes 6 adults)

Additional Cash Needed: Approximately \$25 for meals in route and fun day.
